Some come with little or no Church experiences other than what they have seen on television and other media. For most of these folks. walking into the Church building and Sanctuary can be auite intimidating, even frightening. It is important that we understand our role as "the Body of Christ". Our welcome is the incarnation of God's of welcome. Our treatment newcomers and each other speaks volumes to them about how God wishes to treat them, and the kind of community God has created.

I say these things not to intimidate you as members and keep you on your toes. Rather, I invite you to think about how it must feel for someone walking into the sacred space that contains our community in Worship and being a loving Family of Faith. Think about how we can welcome, affirm and embrace these seekers, and how to integrate them into our family as smoothly and lovingly as we can.

God has placed us here, together, to share the Good News of a God who loves and IS love. How do we incarnate that reality in our welcoming and greeting, in our conversation with them and each other that creates the affirming, caring, and inviting atmosphere that all of us desire? As we begin to reconnect, how can we represent the loving God who formed, forms, and defines us?
